




The devastation on the Grantham Canal last year was a sorry sight to behold. The loss of water affected not only the fish which perished in huge numbers, but waterfowl were left without their food sources, invertebrates and mammals suffered greatly and many simply found they needed to find new habitats.

As a result of the water loss residents came together to form what is now known as WeBCan (short for West Bridgford Canal) with the primary aim to prevent another catastrophe. There have been several public meetings and a committee and constitution has been set up. Grant funding has been obtained and more applications are to be made. There have been working parties on Mondays and Saturdays where hard working volunteers, often in waders, have removed stands of Norfolk reed and reed mace to create a central channel to allow flow of water. The work is ongoing. The canal has leaks which the group are endeavouring to fix. Follow progress via this link - https://www.ladybay.co.uk/friends-of-lady-bay-canal.html or

Lady Bay Birdwatchers: There have been 2 significant sightings during 2023. On 26 Apr a Purple Heron was noted flying over the Hook in the direction of Holme Pierrepont. On 21 Sept 2 Great White Egrets were photographed flying over the eastern end of Lady Bay towards Colwick Woods. Both of these species were new for the area with the Purple Heron being particularly rare. The above 2 records means that the overall total number of species seen within and/or from the Lady Bay boundary is 112 while 87 of these are directly related to The Hook itself. Rushcliffe Borough Councillors for Lady Bay Ward

Local Election May 2023

Thank you for re-electing us as your councillors on Rushcliffe Borough Council for another 4 years - we feel very privileged to represent you and everyone in the enlarged Lady Bay ward which now stretches to Davis Road and is almost twice the size as when we were first elected!

Community Support Scheme

Each councillor on Rushcliffe Borough Council has £1,000 to spend on projects in their ward that benefit their electors. This amount has recently returned to £1,000 after we were told it would be reduced to £500 per councillor. We have given £200 each to WeBCan for removing the reeds and reed mace pulled from the canal by their hard-working volunteers to create a channel to help prevent loss of water. Planning Concerns

If you have concerns about a planning application, please let us know as only an objection from a ward councillor will result in it being voted on at a meeting of the planning committee. Although an application being decided at planning committee does not necessarily mean it will be refused it does mean the decision will be made at a meeting open to the public and at which both the applicant, a representative of the objectors and a ward councillor will be able to have their say. There is also the opportunity to contact the councillors on the planning committee to give them information. Planning applications that do not go to planning committee are decided using 'delegated powers' by planning officers.
