# Lady Bay Birdwatchers Update 8 October 2023 for LBCA

## Highlights

There have been two significant sightings up to now during 2023 which increased the overall total of birds seen/heard within the Lady Bay boundary. On 26 April a Purple Heron was noted flying over The Hook in the direction of Holme Pierrepont. Despite further searches the bird was not relocated. On 21 September two Great White Egrets were photographed flying over the eastern end of Lady Bay towards Colwick Woods. Both of these species were new for the area with the Purple Heron being a particularly rare species. The sighting has been accepted by the Nottinghamshire Birdwatchers records committee.

### Numbers

The above two records means that the overall total number of species seen within and/or from the Lady Bay boundary is 112 while 87 of these are directly related to The Hook itself.

### The Year

Many times this year The Hook has seemed quiet at the commencement of a birdwatch but has always delivered on the average number of species. The maximum number seen during a Saturday morning's Hook Watch to date this year is 39 and the average is roughly 27 species from 27 visits. That is a pretty good total for such a small area. This can be broken down as follows:

- Ist Winter period (Jan-March) average 24 species from 9 visits
- Spring and Summer (April August) average 29 species from 13 visits
