Lady Bay Birdwatchers: 2022 is looking to be even better than previous years for the number of species seen. To date our weekend Garden Watch has knocked up 52 species including five raptors (Red Kite, Peregrine Falcon, Sparrowhawk, Common Buzzard, Kestrel) and two woodpeckers, while our regular Saturday morning Hook Watch has recorded 62 species. Local Election Changes for May 2023

There are 2 important changes to look out for in the borough council elections next year:

- 1. Voter ID. You will need to bring photo ID with you to vote in this & all future elections. Look out for more information on this from Rushcliffe Borough Council nearer the time, they will help you with this. The government says it is necessary to cut down on voting fraud, even though there hasn't been any fraud anywhere in the country!
- 2. Polling Stations. There are 2 polling stations in Lady Bay ward, the Scout HQ on Trent Boulevard & All Hallows Church Hall on Pierrepont Road. When you get your polling card check which place you should go to vote; it might have changed. This is because Lady Bay ward is getting bigger & will include several streets now in Abbey ward, & the number of people assigned to each polling station has to be roughly the same.

Community Support Scheme
